

Central Coast Broadband Consortium 3 year project


- Priority is infrastructure and economic development.

- Continuing vision and roadmap for broadband development.




Santa Cruz County adopting broadband policy

- Model for region and state.








Mapping leads to muni broadband projects


Watsonville replacing Charter fiber, Salinas considering loop


UCSC-led middle mile project


Industrial grade fiber route:


Santa Cruz -Watsonville -Castroville - Salinas -Chualar - Gonzales -Soledad


CCBC draft framework
