We are writing to support and applaud the Proposed Decision (PD) of
Administrative Law Judge Karl J. Bemserderfer in the matter pertaining to the
Comcast Corporation acquisition of Time Warner Cable (TWC) and trade of
service Territories with Charter Communications. The conditions in the PD will
ensure that there will be a significant public benefit for California consumers
resulting from this corporate consolidation and all low-income households will
have the opportunity to subscribe to high-speed Internet at home.

Today, 25% of Californians are stuck on the other side of the Digital Divide up
against a wall of poverty and not likely to be able to fully participate in our
democracy or contribute to our economy without high-speed Internet access at
home. With one bold action to adopt the PD you will open up opportunities to
millions of families and their children and will transform the California economy
and quality of life forever. We urge you to continue your tradition of trailblazing
leadership in the public interest.

Historically, the California Public Utilities Commission has been a national leader
on promoting broadband deployment and adoption to close the Digital Divide.
We know that each of you has specialized expertise on Digital Inclusion and
welcome your policy contributions to enhance the PD. We also realize that you
may be under a pressure from the applicant and their allies to weaken the ALJ
PD conditions of approval, but we trust that your leadership will rise above the
politics to advance sound public policy for all consumers in a Digital Age.
