APPLICATION OF COMCAST PHONE OF CALIFORNIA, LLC (U-5698-C)

Pursuant to the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure and pertinent Commission decisions, Comcast Phone of California, LLC (U-5698-C) ("Comcast Phone" or "Applicant") submits this Application to expand the territorial scope of its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to include the service territory of Ponderosa Telephone Co. ("Ponderosa").¹ In support of its application, Comcast Phone submits the following information:

I. NAME OF APPLICANT [RULE 2.1(a)]

The legal name of Applicant is Comcast Phone of California, LLC. Comcast Phone is a

Delaware limited liability company with its principal place of business at 1701 John F. Kennedy

Blvd., Philadelphia, PA 19103. Comcast Phone holds a CPCN (U-5698-C) from the

Commission to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange and interexchange

telecommunications services in California as a competitive local exchange carrier.²

III. ORGANIZATION AND QUALIFICATION TO TRANSACT BUSINESS [RULE 2.2]

A Certificate of Formation issued by the State of Delaware, as amended, and a Certificate of Good Standing issued by the California Secretary of State are attached as **Attachment A** to this Application.

IV. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION [RULE 3.1]

Comcast Phone anticipates that it will engage in minimal construction as it plans to rely largely on the facilities of its cable service provider affiliate to provide services. Comcast Phone expects that its construction activities will be limited to installation of equipment in existing buildings or structures, consistent with the "limited facilities based authority" that it currently holds elsewhere in the state. Comcast Phone seeks to have this authority extended to the Ponderosa service territory. If the construction of new facilities becomes necessary or desirable, Comcast Phone will seek to expand the scope of its authority accordingly.

V. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT [RULE 2.4]

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and Commission Rule 2.4, the Commission examines projects to evaluate and avoid negative environmental impacts and to maintain and restore environmental quality to the fullest extent possible. In 2005, the Commission found that Comcast Phone's "local exchange services will not have a significant adverse effect upon the environment."³ That finding remains applicable today, as Comcast Phone's construction activities remain largely unchanged since that time. Also, the scope of Comcast Phone's potential activities in the Ponderosa service territory would be exempt from CEQA under the "Class 1 Exemption."⁴ Consequently, no Environmental Impact Report or Negative Declaration are required.

Should Comcast Phone need to perform activities that are not exempt from CEQA, it will seek additional authority and submit to any necessary CEQA review.

VI. FACTS SHOWING PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY [RULE 3.1(e)]

Granting Comcast Phone's Application will serve the public interest. The Legislature has long promoted market competition to "encourage the ubiquitous availability of a wide choice of state-of-the-art [telecommunications] services."⁵ The Commission has likewise found that the presence of competition in local telecommunications markets leads to efficient pricing, improved

service quality, expanded product and service capabilities, greater reliability, and increased consumer choice.⁶ Comcast Phone's services advance these policies by enabling its wholesale customers to offer innovative IP-enabled and voice over Internet protocol services, as Comcast Phone's experience in other markets in California and elsewhere demonstrates.

The Commission has historically insulated rural local exchange carriers ("RLECs"), such as Ponderosa, from wireline competition based on the concern that RLECs might be financially injured by competition.⁷ However, the competition study recently issued in the High Cost Fund-A proceeding (R.11-11-007) should allay that concern, as it concluded that "[o]pening Small ILEC territories to wireline voice competition is not expected to have a significant direct impact on Small ILECs and their customers"⁸ The Commission should endorse this finding and grant Comcast Phone's request to enter Ponderosa's service territory so that Californians living in that area can receive the benefits that accrue when companies compete for their business.

VII. NAMES OF COMPETITORS AND NAMES OF COUNTIES [RULE 3.1(b)]

Pursuant to D. 97-06-107, issued in Commission Proceeding R.94-02-003/ I.94-02-004, applications such as this one are exempt from rule 3.1(b).

VIII. MAP OF SERVICE AREAS [RULE 3.1(c)]

Comcast Phone seeks expanded authority to provide its services, as described herein,

within the service territory of Ponderosa Telephone Co. reflected on the map attached as

Attachment B.⁹

IX. FRANCHISES, HEALTH AND SAFETY PERMITS REQUIRED FOR CONSTRUCTION [RULE 3.1(d)]

Comcast Phone will obtain any necessary local franchises or health and safety permits required for its activities in Ponderosa's service territory.

X. ESTIMATED COST OF CONSTRUCTION [RULE 3.1(f)]

The estimated cost of construction is expected to be *de minimis* since Comcast Phone does not anticipate constructing facilities. As described in this Application, Comcast Phone will rely on its cable affiliate's existing infrastructure.

XI. FINANCIAL ABILITY AND RATES [RULE 3.1(g) AND (h)]

Comcast Phone has the financial ability to provide service in the Ponderosa service territory, consistent with the Commission's findings in D. 05-12-031, and as demonstrated by its business activities since that time. Comcast Phone's annual fixed and operating costs are expected to be fully within the financial resources available to Comcast Phone and its corporate affiliates through existing resources and anticipated revenues. Comcast Phone has also filed a copy of its performance bond with the Commission, consistent with D. 13-05-035.

Comcast Phone will be offering service in competitive markets and its rates will be set accordingly. Comcast Phone's current tariff, which would apply to service offered in the Ponderosa territory, is on file with the Commission.

XII. STATEMENT OF MATERIAL FINANCIAL INTERESTS (GENERAL ORDER 104-A STATEMENT) [RULE 3.1(i)]

Although Comcast Phone is not a publicly traded company, it is the indirect subsidiary of

Comcast Corporation, and in satisfaction of Rule 3.1(i), incorporates by reference its Securities

and Exchange Commission filings, including its proxy statements, 10-K, and Annual Reports.¹⁰

XIII. ESTIMATED NUMBER OF CUSTOMERS FOR THE FIRST AND THE FIFTH YEAR [RULE 3.1(j)]

Comcast Phone anticipates providing Local Interconnection Service¹¹ to its interconnected VoIP service provider affiliate. Comcast also anticipates serving an indeterminate number of interexchange carriers seeking to terminate calls to Comcast's VoIP

provider affiliate's customers.

XIV. MANAGERIAL AND TECHNICAL COMPETENCE [RULE 2.1(d) CERTIFICATION D. 13-05-035]

Comcast Phone possesses significant managerial and technical expertise for providing

services in the Ponderosa service territory, consistent with the Commission's requirements.

Attached hereto as Attachment C are the biographies of key management and technical

personnel.

Because this Application seeks authority to expand the scope of authority for an existing

CPCN holder, Applicant respectfully submits that the certification under D. 13-05-035 is not

required. However, out of an abundance of caution, Applicant provides the certification attached as

Attachment D.

XV. DEMONSTRATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH COMMISSION RULES

Attachment E to this Application is a schedule listing Comcast Phone's compliance with applicable Rules.

XVI. REQUEST FOR EXEMPTIONS

Applicant respectfully requests that it be accorded the same streamlined regulatory treatment received by other CLECs (per D. 96-02-075) and other non-dominant interexchange carriers (NDIECs), including:

1. Applicant seeks exemption from the provisions of Pub. Util. Code sections 816-830 (pertaining to the issuance of stocks and securities) and Pub. Util. Code section 851 (pertaining to the transfer or encumbrance of utility assets when such transfer or encumbrance is for the purpose of securing debt). The Commission has previously concluded that NDIECs should be exempt from the provisions and requirements of Pub. Util. Code sections 816-830 and 851 (insofar as these sections pertain to the issuance of securities and transfer or encumbrance of utility property for purposes of securing debt) in D. 85-07-081, D. 85-11-044, and D. 86-08-057, as confirmed by D. 90-09-032. This exemption was extended to CLECs in D. 96-02-072, Ordering Paragraph 18.

2. Applicant further requests that it be exempted from any requirement to maintain its books and records in accordance with the Uniform System of Accounts specified in Title 47 I.E. Part 32 consistent with D. 99-02-038, which relieved CLECs that are not part of an ILEC corporate entity from the requirement to keep their books of account in conformance with the Uniform System of Accounts.

XVII. SCOPING MEMORANDUM INFORMATION [RULE 2.1(c)]

In accordance with the Commission's Rules governing compliance with Senate Bill 960, Comcast Phone provides the following information: <u>Proposed Category</u>: This Application should be categorized as ratesetting in accordance with Rule 7.1(e)(2) as it does not clearly fit into the categories defined in Rules 1.3(a) and (d).

2. <u>Need for Hearing</u>: No hearings are necessary to address the matters in this Application as the Application is non-controversial and does not raise any material issues of fact.

3. <u>Issues to Be Considered</u>: Whether the Commission should modify Comcast Phone's CPCN in the manner requested in the Application.

4. <u>Proposed Schedule</u>:

Comcast Phone requests that the Commission evaluate its Application for a CPCN on an expedited basis. Comcast Phone is eager to pursue opportunities to offer services in Ponderosa's service territory. Rule 14.6(c)(2) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure allows for the Commission to waive the period for public review and comment on proposed decisions in the event that a matter is uncontested and where the decision grants the relief requested. Assuming that no protests are filed, Comcast Phone requests that the Commission waive the period for public comment and process Comcast Phone's application according to the following schedule:

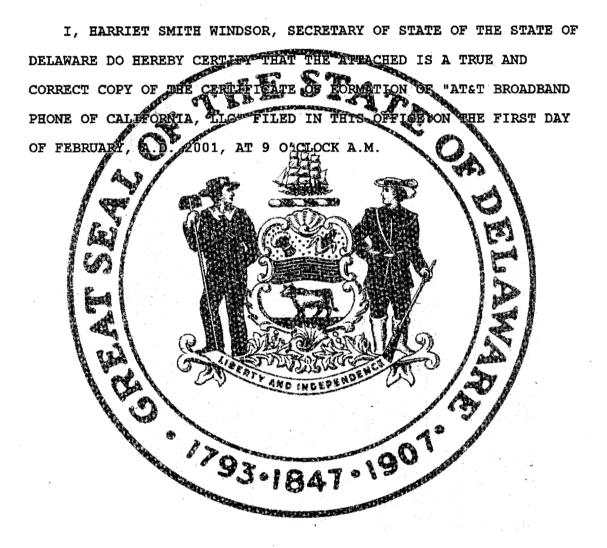

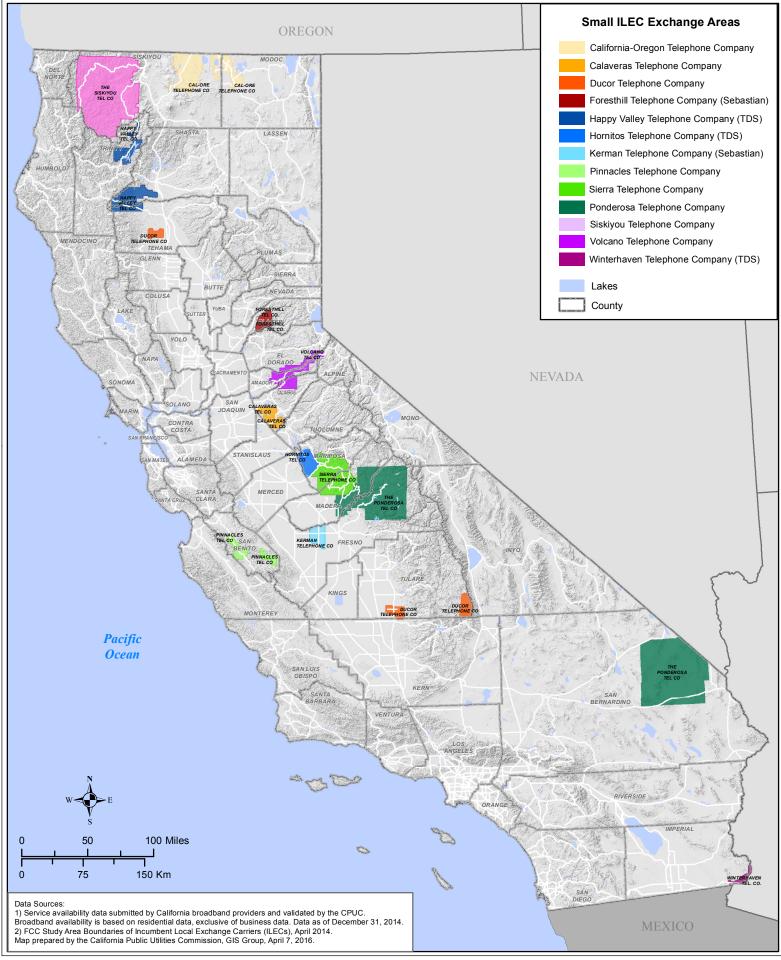

BIOGRAPHIES

Jeff Votaw, Regional Vice President of Engineering

As Regional Vice President of Engineering for Comcast in California, Votaw is responsible for leading a team of approximately 300 people in the Engineering and Constructions teams. Votaw is charged with setting the pace of deployment for next generation fiber infrastructure projects and oversees a capital budget of ~\$350 Million.

Previously, Regional Vice President of Technical Operations for California, Votaw oversaw all aspects of Comcast's technical operations in California and before that as Area Vice President, Field Operations for Sacramento Valley, Votaw oversaw all aspects of Comcast's operations in the greater Sacramento area as well as Stockton, Modesto, Tracy, Chico, Yuba City, Placerville and Sonora. Votaw also served as Vice President of Field Operations for South Valley.

A 35 year veteran of the cable industry, Votaw began his career in cable just after high school in an entry level position for Viacom Cable. During the next 14 years, he held various field positions until 1995 when he was promoted in to his first leadership role as Network Supervisor in San Rafael CA. A year later, he was promoted to Technical Operations Manager and then to Regional Construction Manager where he was responsible for building advanced networks in the San Francisco Bay Area. In 1997, Votaw relocated to Washington State where he put his years of experience to work designing, building and staffing a start-up telecommunications company for the City of Tacoma. This certification is made on information and belief after a reasonable investigation.

If granted the requested expanded CPCN, Applicant agrees to comply with all federal and state statutes, rules, and regulations.

Commission Decision 13-05-035 requires a broad certification not only from an applicant but also its "affiliates, officers, directors, partners, agents, or owners (directly or indirectly) of more than 10% of registrant, or anyone acting in a management capacity." Given the size of Applicant's parent company, Comcast Corporation, its numerous affiliates and the large number of employees who could potentially be deemed to be acting in a "management capacity," it would be unreasonably burdensome for Applicant to make the certification for all affiliates and all those potentially acting in a management capacity. Applicant has used its best efforts to provide a certification that covers the last five years for Applicant, its officers (Applicant does not have any directors), Comcast Phone, LLC (Applicant's immediate parent), Comcast Cable Communications, LLC (Applicant's intermediate parent), Comcast Holdings Corporation (Applicant's intermediate patent), Comcast Corporation (Applicant's ultimate parent), and Comcast OTR1, LLC (U-4508-C) (Applicant's California wireless registrant affiliate) (collectively the "Affiliates"). To the extent that Applicant cannot make one of the required averments, it has provided relevant documentation.¹

All officers of Applicant have been employed by Comcast for more than the last five years and, to the best of their knowledge, none have personally (a) been found liable for fraud, dishonesty, failure to disclose, or misrepresentations to consumers or others; (b) been convicted of a felony; (c) been the subject of a criminal referral by judge or public agency; (d) entered into settlement of criminal or civil claims involving violations of sections 17000 *et seq.*, 17200 *et seq.*, or 17500 *et seq.* of the California Business & Professions Code, or of any other statute, regulation, or decisional law relating to fraud, dishonesty, failure to disclose, or misrepresentations to consumers or others; (e) been found to have violated any statute, law, or rule pertaining to public utilities or other regulated industries; (f) entered into any settlement agreements or made any voluntary payments or agreed to any other type of monetary forfeitures in resolution of any action by any regulatory body, agency, or attorney general; or (g) been investigated by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") or any law enforcement or regulatory agency for failure to comply with any law, rule, or order.

Key Regulatory Settlements and Judgments

- 1. In 2015, Comcast Phone of California, LLC settled with the Commission and California Attorney General to resolve investigations into Comcast's inadvertent disclosure of nonpublished listing information for approximately 75,000 California non-pub customers during the period of July 2010 to December 2012. The settlement was approved in Commission Decision No. 15-09-009, and the final judgment and permanent injunction stipulated to by Comcast, the California Attorney General, and the Commission was entered by the Alameda Superior Court on September 17, 2015. Comcast paid a \$25 million fine and provided additional customer compensation totaling \$8.4 million. Comcast also agreed to certain operational concessions for a three-year period.
- 2. In 2015, Comcast Cable Communications, LLC entered into a settlement with the California Attorney General and Alameda County regarding the company's disposal of certain electronics, as well as an inquiry into the adequacy of Comcast's efforts to protect customer information during the disposition of certain customer records. The resulting settlement agreement and consent judgment did not include any admission of violation; however, Comcast agreed to pay the state of California \$25.95 million. Compliance and reporting obligations are ongoing.
- 3. In 2016, Comcast Corporation entered into a Consent Decree with the FCC to resolve an investigation regarding Comcast's compliance with the "negative option billing" statute and rule prohibiting cable operators from placing charges for products or services on subscribers' bills that they did not affirmatively request. Under the Consent Decree, there was no admission of liability, but Comcast agreed to implement and abide by a compliance plan for five years to improve its customer experience. Comcast made a \$2.3 million payment to the U.S. Treasury, but the FCC Enforcement Bureau and Comcast specifically acknowledged that no agreement was reached on the applicability of the Enforcement Bureau's interpretation of the "negative option billing" rules in this matter.
- 4. The Tennis Channel filed a complaint with the FCC alleging violation of 47 USC § 536 and the agency's program carriage rules by Comcast Cable Communications, LLC. An administrative law judge found a violation of 47 CFR § 1301, but the decision was appealed and overturned by the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia in 2013. Petition for certiorari to the United States Supreme Court was denied. On remand to the FCC, The Tennis Channel requested the FCC to reevaluate its decision and affirm the prior decision on "new evidence"—the agency declined to do. Tennis Channel appealed again to the United States Court of Appeals which again rejected its appeal, ending the case in 2016.
- 5. In 2009, the West Virginia Attorney General filed a complaint in West Virginia state court, alleging that Comcast Corporation improperly "ties" the rental of set-top boxes to the provision of digital cable services. The Attorney General also alleged a claim for unjust enrichment/restitution. Comcast removed the case to the United States District Court for West Virginia, and it was subsequently transferred to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and consolidated with multidistrict litigation. After an

exhaustive procedural history, private plaintiffs entered into settlement with Comcast in 2018.

- 6. A settlement agreement with the Delaware Attorney General's (DE AG) Office was executed on September 19, 2017. The terms of the settlement required updating marketing language and a payment of \$5,000 to cover investigatory and legal costs relating to the subpoena.
- 7. An Assurance of Voluntary Discontinuance resolving the Massachusetts Attorney General's Office's (MA AG) investigation was filed with the Suffolk County Superior Court in Massachusetts on November 9, 2018. Comcast has agreed to a payment to the state of \$250,000; restitution in the amount of \$700,000 to be issued as refunds to customers who paid early termination fees; and forgiveness of debt for customers who were charged but did not pay early termination fees. Comcast also agreed to update its marketing language.
