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[[APPROVING USE OF FIBER OPTIC CABLES PURSUANT TO GAS AND ELECTRIC FRANCHISES FOR UTILITY PURPOSES] APPROVING THE USE BY THE PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY FOR UTILITY PURPOSES THOSE FIBER OPTIC FACILITIES CONSTRUCTED, LAID, AND USED. PURSUANT TO THE GAS-AND ELECTRIC FRANCHISES (ORDINANCE NOS. 413 AND 414 [SERIES 1939], RESPECTIVELY)

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. WHEREAS, Pacific Gas & Electric Company ("PG&E") is the grantee of those certain franchise ordinances to introduce into, transmit, distribute and supply gas (No. 413. series 1939) and electricity (No. 414 series 1939) to the City and County of San Francisco (the "City") and its inhabitants (the "Franchises"); and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to such franchises PG&E is authorized to construct, lay and use in the public streets and rights-of-way of the City those facilities necessary or proper for the introduction into, transmission, distribution and supply of gas or electricity to the City and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, PG&E has, pursuant to such franchises, constructed, laid and used in the public streets and rights-of-way of the City certain communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, to facilitate and enhance the introduction into, transmission, distribution and supply of gas and electricity to and within the City, which facilities are "used or useful" for said purpose; and

whereas, It is in the public interest that PG&E construct, lay and use such communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, so as to facilitate the provision of franchised utility services and to enhance the safety and reliability of the gas and electricity transmission, distribution and supply systems in the City; and

WHEREAS, PG&E and the City contemporaneously herewith have entered into certain other agreements, including the Master Agreement on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the City shall and hereby does recognize and acknowledge that communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities used to facilitate telecommunications in connection with the franchised activities, are "used or useful" for the introduction into, transmission, distribution and supply of gas and electricity to and within the City and that the construction, laying and use of such communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, in the public streets and rights-of-way pursuant to the Franchises is necessary or proper therefor; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the recognition and acknowledgement in this resolution is limited insofar as such communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, are constructed, laid and used for the reasonable and demonstrable purpose of facilitating telecommunications in connection with the franchised activities and are not constructed, laid or used solely for the purpose of

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undertaking any lease, license, or other arrangement whereby thirdparties may use or share such facilities; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City recognizes and acknowledges that communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, are and may be "used and useful" in the introduction into, transmission, distribution and supply of gas and electricity within the City; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That PG&E may, consistent with the Franchises. lease or license unused capacity in properly constructed, laid and used communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, to third parties, including any affiliate of PG&E engaged in the business of providing telecommunications services (so long as such third-parties, including any affiliate of PG&E engaged in the provision of telecommunications services, have obtained a valid franchise, encroachment or other legal authority to occupy the public streets and rights-of-way of the City for such purpose as the communications circuits, including fiber optic facilities, are to be used), provided that any lease is approved by the California Public Utilities Commission pursuant to any necessary proceeding under section 851 of the California Public Utilities Code, and that for a commercially reasonable period of time prior to the filing and approval of an 851 petition, PG&E may license the use of such facilities to the third-party that is the subject of the petition; and be it

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7/2/97 rlh 20 by City to verify and enforce the terms and conditions of the Franchises or this Resolution, PG&E shall cooperate with the City in any audit or inquiry related thereto including but not limited to the production of documentary, topographic, financial or other such information as may be relevant to such audit or inquiry, provided however that such information shall, where appropriate, be treated as confidential by the City pursuant to Evidence Code section 1040, and provided further that such information may not be considered or used by the City for purposes other than the audit or inquiry as stated above; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be null and void unless the Master Agreement shall become and remain effective for its term; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall be null and void in the event that the Fiber Optic Cable Agreement by and between PG&E and the City (Appendix J to the Master Agreement of 1997 by and between PG&E and City) is rejected by the California Public Utilities Commission, or is approved in such a manner or with such conditions as are not mutually acceptable to the City and to PG&E; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That no agreements or contracts shall be executed or implemented under the provisions of this Resolution unless and until PG&E agrees that it shall be bound by all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations, including the provisions of Chapters 12B and 12C of the City's Administrative Code.
