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Pursuant to Rules 11.1 and 11.4 of the California Public Utilities Commission’s (“Commission”) Rules of Practice and Procedure, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) files this Motion for Leave to File Under Seal the additional evidence requested by Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) Patricia Miles during the evidentiary hearing (“EH”) of the above-referenced proceeding.

On October 10, 2018, Crown Castle filed an application for arbitration against PG&E, pursuant to Commission Decision 98-10-058. On November 29, 2018, an EH was held at the Commission. During that EH, ALJ Miles requested that PG&E provide the Northern California Joint Pole Association (“NCJPA”) document^{1/} referenced in the Prepared Rebuttal Testimony of PG&E witness Tinamarie De Teresa.^{2/} This NCJPA document contains certain confidential pole information pertaining to Crown Castle, which ALJ Miles indicated would be accepted by the Commission under seal.^{3/} ALJ Miles also allowed for PG&E to redact information from the

The confidential information shall remain under seal, and shall not be made accessible or disclosed to anyone other than the Commission staff except on the further order or ruling of the Commission, the Assigned Commissioner, the Assigned Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”), or the ALJ then designated as Law and Motion Judge.
